SUPERVISED RELEASE

Upon release from imprisonment, the defendant shall be placed on supervised release for a term of **thirty-one (31) months**.

The defendant must report to the probation office in the district to which the defendant is released within 72 hours of release from custody of the Bureau of Prisons.

The defendant shall not commit another federal, state or local crime.

The defendant shall not unlawfully possess a controlled substance. The defendant shall refrain from any unlawful use of a controlled substance. The defendant shall submit to one drug test within 15 days of release from imprisonment and at least two periodic drug tests thereafter, as determined by the court.

- The above drug testing condition is suspended, based on the court's determination that the defendant poses a low risk of future substance abuse.
- The defendant shall not possess a firearm, ammunition, destructive device, or any other dangerous weapon.
- The defendant shall cooperate in the collection of DNA as directed by the probation officer.
- The defendant shall comply with the requirements of the Sex Offender Registration and Notification Act (42 U.S.C. § 16901, *et seq.*) as directed by the probation officer, the Bureau of Prisons, or any state sex offender registration agency in which he or she resides, works, is a student, or was convicted of a qualifying offense.
- The defendant shall participate in an approved program for domestic violence.

If this judgment imposes a fine or restitution it is a condition of supervised release that the defendant pay in accordance with the Schedule of Payments sheet of this judgment

The defendant must comply with the standard conditions that have been adopted by this court as well as any additional conditions on the attached page.

STANDARD CONDITIONS OF SUPERVISION

1. the defendant shall not leave the judicial district without the permission of the court or probation officer;
2. the defendant shall report to the probation officer and shall submit a truthful and complete written report within the first five days of each month;
3. the defendant shall answer truthfully all inquiries by the probation officer and follow the instructions of the probation officer;
4. the defendant shall support his or her dependents and meet other family responsibilities;
5. the defendant shall work regularly at a lawful occupation, unless excused by the probation officer for schooling, training, or other acceptable reasons;
6. the defendant shall notify the probation officer at least ten (10) days prior to any change in residence or employment;
7. the defendant shall refrain from excessive use of alcohol and shall not purchase, possess, use, distribute, or administer any controlled substance or any paraphernalia related to any controlled substances, except as prescribed by a physician;
8. the defendant shall not frequent places where controlled substances are illegally sold, used, distributed, or administered;
9. the defendant shall not associate with any persons engaged in criminal activity and shall not associate with any person convicted of a felony, unless granted permission to do so by the probation officer;
10. the defendant shall permit a probation officer to visit him or her at any time at home or elsewhere and shall permit confiscation of any contraband observed in plain view by the probation officer;
11. the defendant shall notify the probation officer within seventy-two (72) hours of being arrested or questioned by a law enforcement officer;
12. the defendant shall not enter into any agreement to act as an informer or a special agent of a law enforcement agency without the permission of the court; and
13. as directed by the probation officer, the defendant shall notify third parties of risks that may be occasioned by the defendant's criminal record or personal history or characteristics, and shall permit the probation officer to make such notifications and to confirm the defendant's compliance with such notification requirement.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF SUPERVISION

1. The defendant shall not knowingly associate with activists involved with animal rights or environmental organizations that have a history of violence or condoning violence as a means of protest or demonstration, including but not limited to Earth First!, The Earth Liberation Front and the Animal Liberation Front.
2. The defendant shall not publish in print media or on the internet any publications for or in relation to the Animal Liberation Front or The Earth Liberation Front, Earth First!, or any other organization that has a history of violence or that encourages, incites, or calls for illegal activities or violence.
3. The defendant shall submit to a search of person, property (including but not limited to computer, electronic devices, and storage media), residence, office, or vehicle, at a reasonable time and in a reasonable manner, by the probation officer.
4. The defendant shall provide the probation officer access to any requested financial information.
5. The defendant is prohibited from making major purchases, incurring new financial obligations, or entering into any financial contracts without the prior approval of the probation officer.
6. The defendant shall not personally, or through third parties, access, own, use or possess any type or form of computers (hardware or software), computer-related devices, or other forms of wireless communication without the advance written approval of the probation officer. Any approved computer/computer-related devices shall be subject to computer monitoring or search.
7. The defendant shall consent to computer monitoring as directed by the probation office and shall cooperate with the computer monitoring participant agreement. The defendant shall pay for computer monitoring services as directed by the probation office.
8. The defendant shall provide a list of all computers and computer-related devices located or stored in his residence and/or place of employment.
9. The defendant's travel shall be restricted to Allegan, Barry, Kent, and Ottawa counties in the Western District of Michigan.
10. The defendant shall be placed on electronic monitoring, which may include the use of Global Position Satellite (GPS) technology, to monitor travel restriction, for a period of **three (3) months**, as arranged by the probation officer. During this time, the defendant shall remain at his place of residence except for employment and other activities approved in advance by the probation officer. The defendant shall maintain a telephone at his place of residence without any call forwarding, caller ID, call waiting, modems, answering machines, cordless telephones, or other special services for the above period. The defendant shall wear an electronic device, shall observe the program rules, and shall pay the costs of electronic monitoring as directed by the probation officer.
11. The defendant shall not personally, or through third parties, maintain or have access to a post office box without the prior written approval of the probation officer.
12. The defendant shall provide the probation officer with a list of all addresses where mail is received or sent from.
13. The defendant's employment and residence must be approved in advanced by the probation officer.
14. The defendant shall surrender any current passports to the probation office during the term of supervised release. The defendant shall not apply for any new passports during such time frame.
15. The defendant shall not possess or be the primary user of any cellular phone or other mobile telecommunications device without prior permission from the probation officer. If given permission to use/possess a cell phone, the defendant must provide the number to the probation officer and the phone must be maintained in the defendant's name or another name approved in advance by the probation officer.

16. The defendant shall close all current Facebook or social networking accounts and shall not establish any new accounts without the permission of the probation officer.
17. The defendant shall discontinue use of Riseup.net.
18. The defendant shall submit to random polygraphs as directed by the probation officer related to compliance with terms of supervised release.
